TERM	ABBREVIATION	STITCH INSTRUCTIONS
Back post double crochet	bpgc	Yarn over, insert hook from back to front around the post of indicated stitch and complete a normal double crochet stitch.
Chain	ch	Yarn over, pull through.
Double crochet	dc	Yarn over, insert hook into indicated stitch, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through two loops, yarn over, pull through remaining two loops on hook.
Front post treble crochet	fp3tr	Yarn over twice, insert hook from front to back around the post of indicated stitch and complete a normal treble crochet stitch.
Hidden stitch		<u>Link to what is a hidden stitch</u>
Magic circle	mc	<u>Link to how I make a magic circle.</u>
Needle join	nj	When you have finished your last stitch do not slip stitch into the first stitch as you would normally do. Instead cut the yarn leaving a 10 – 12 cm tail and pull the loop through the last stitch. Thread the tail onto a needle. Insert the needle under both loops of the second stitch of the round/row. Gently thread the needle back through the top of the back loop and the third loop of the last stitch of the round/row, and gently tighten the join, and it will form a "loop" on top of the stitch and look just like a regular stitch. <u>Link to how I make a needle join</u>
Repeat	rep	Repeat the stitches between *. * the required number of times. Or **. ** the required number of times.
Reverse single crochet	rev sc	<u>Link to how to make the reverse single crochet/crab stitch</u>
Skip	sk	Skip a stitch or space.
Slip stitch	ss	Insert hook into stitch, yarn over, pull through both the stitch and loop on hook.
Standing double crochet		<u>Link to how I make a standing double crochet</u>
Stitch/es	st/s	The stitch itself.
Stitch marker	sm	You can use any stitch marker to mark a particular stitch.
Space	sp	This is the space between stitches.
